

Clerks Report for April 22

Playing Field:

The work to clear behind the playing field fence has been started the first section is clear. Cllr Clarke has forwarded the contact details of those who enquired about collecting logs and we are hopeful to start having these collected in the near future (weather permitting).

The anti-climb painting has been started; this may have to be an annual job as the painting that was carried out last year was found to be in need of another coat.

Enquiries have been made for the installation of the ball stop netting and we are hopeful that we will receive a quote in the near future.

The order has been given for the steps to be replaced down to the lower section of the park, we are currently awaiting a start date from the contractor for this work.

The work to repair the wall has commenced and it is estimated that this will be complete by the 8th May.

A new contract is currently being arranged for the CCTV supply. Once we have a date for the meter installation, we will then book the electrician to return and complete the work.

Cemetery:

The new benches have been ordered and are due to arrive at the beginning of June, the contractor has not provided a start date for this work at the moment.

Gate and gullies: The contractor has been notified but there has been an increase in the cost of materials required. Awaiting email confirmation from Cllrs on the increase prior to issuing an order number for the work.

General:

Hendra Prazey: The shed has been emptied and removed. A meeting has been held with Cornwall Council regarding the repairs required to the banks of the leat. A full report from this meeting will be circulated to Cllrs.

Bus Shelters: An order has been issued for the replacement Perspex panels, we are awaiting confirmation of a start date.

Public Toilets: The toilet roll dispenser has been damaged, this has been reported to the police online. A replacement toilet roll holder has been ordered.

Office:

The new computers have been installed and are working well.

The paperwork for the Annual Audit is almost complete and the internal Auditor will be starting the review this week.
