

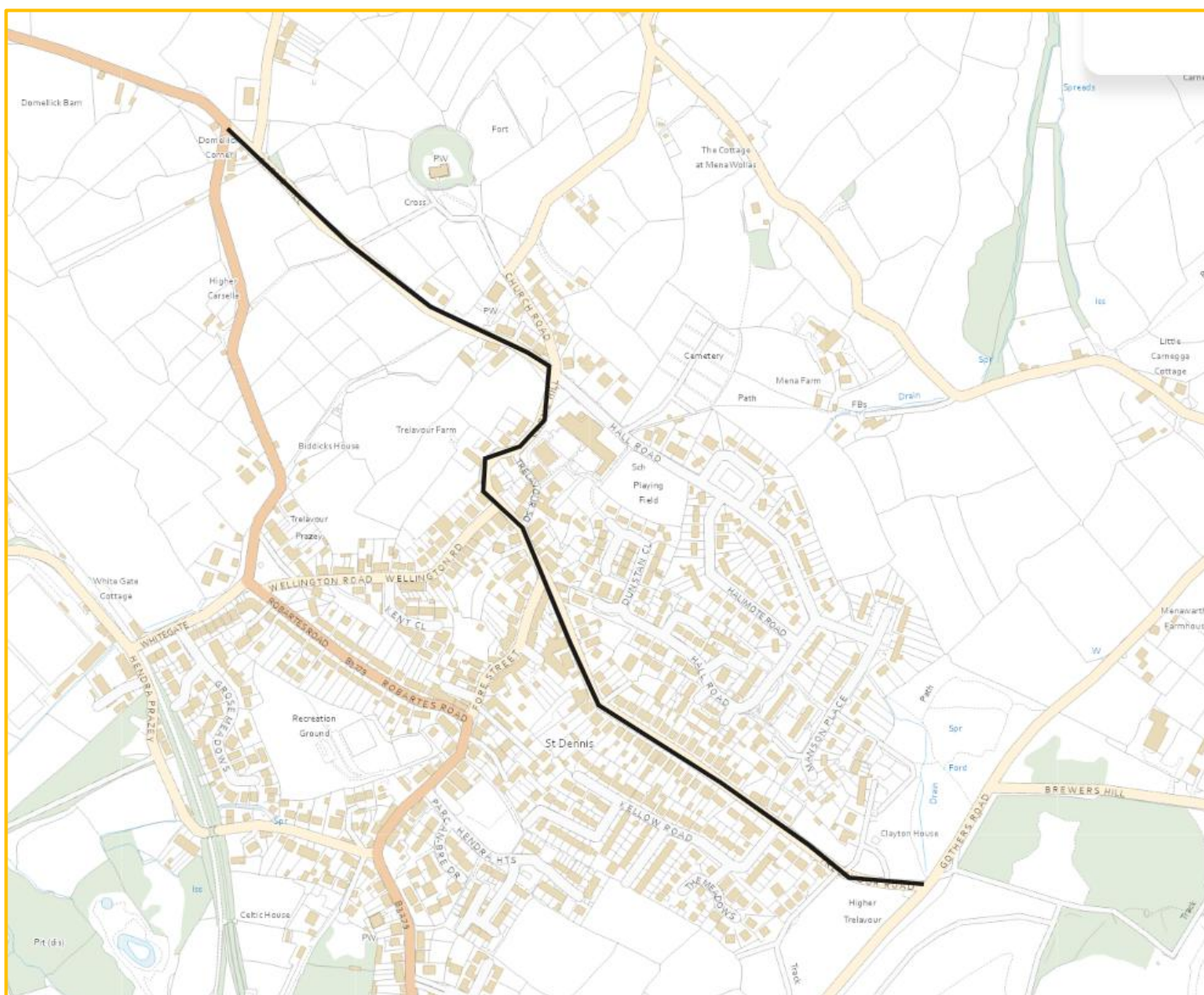
Highway maintenance scheme • August 2026

St Dennis Carriageway Repair Works

As part of our highways maintenance work, a road closure will be in place on Carne Hill & Trelavour Road, St Dennis from **Monday 3rd August** while carriageway patching and resurfacing work is carried out. The closure will be in place weekdays only between **07:30 & 17:00** and is expected to take up to **four weeks** to complete.

During working hours, a Clearway Parking Zone will be in force along the full extent of the site. Any vehicles parked in the signed areas during this time will be towed & charges will apply. Any designated parking bays within the area will be suspended. Please see the reverse for more information.

We will have marshals on site to support residents and businesses needing local access.

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Clearway Parking Zone

Introducing Clearway zones in nominated roadwork sites across Cornwall allows the removal of parked vehicles which are obstructing highway maintenance and improvement works.

Under the Traffic Management Act 2004, Cormac, on behalf of the council, will declare nominated roads a Clearway zone for the period of the works. All households and businesses in the affected area will receive a letter before the work starts and signs will be in place to inform road users about the parking restrictions.

While the majority of vehicle owners ensure their vehicles are not causing an obstruction; occasionally, vehicles are left parked despite being notified in advance through signage and direct communications.

The site team will make every effort to try to find the driver or owner of any car parked before requesting its removal.

If a vehicle is towed away for parking in a clearway zone an approved contractor will remove the vehicle to a safe place. **Charges will apply.**

The owner/keeper will need to phone **0300 1234 222** to arrange collection of the vehicle.

Diversions

Signs will be placed at major junctions prior to the closure on the key routes to take non-through traffic away from the closure and keep traffic disruption to a minimum.

Diversion routes have to be suitable for the type of traffic that would normally use the route. We appreciate they can sometimes be quite lengthy, but in order to carry out the works safely to protect our operatives and road users we need to implement these measures.

Access arrangements

Access for residents and businesses will be maintained through gateways managed by traffic marshals, but there will be significant delays.

Residents will need to stop at the gateways and our staff will help you to get into, or out of the roadworks site safely using the right route.

Please be supportive by respecting and responding to any speed restrictions and the safety instructions given by staff.

If our teams need access or have to move machinery out of the way there will be significant delays, or you may be asked to access from the other end of the closure

We will always do our best to accommodate day-to-day requirements of people affected by our works, and access will be maintained as much as possible for those people directly impacted by the closure.

Emergency access will be maintained at all times.

Working safely

Please be aware of the following hazards while the work is taking place.

- Uneven road surface where the old surface has been removed
- Raised manholes, gullies, and other service boxes
- Varying kerb heights when stepping off the footway
- Please use any designated crossing points provided

All of our sites will be appropriately risk assessed and have strict safeguarding measures in line with current Health and Safety and Public Health England guidance to ensure the safety of residents and our staff.

Notifications

Please note this information is correct at the time of circulation but is subject to change at short notice, especially in periods of poor weather.

Resurfacing work is weather dependent and may be delayed by cold temperatures and heavy rain.

If works are postponed or cancelled, we will do our best to update the advance notice boards on our sites.
